RESOLVE

Providing for Certain Improvements at the Industrial School
for Boys.

1 *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding three thousand
2 three hundred and forty-five dollars be paid out of the
3 treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,
4 to be expended under the direction of the trustees of
5 Massachusetts trainings schools, at the industrial school
6 for boys, for the following purposes: — For relocating and
7 renovating a Shaker cottage, a sum not exceeding fifteen
8 hundred and forty-five dollars; and for remodeling elec-
9 tric distributing system, a sum not exceeding eighteen
10 hundred dollars.
