The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act Regulating Auction Sales.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section two the
3 following new section:—

4 *Section 2A.* Sales by auction of jewelry, watches,
5 diamonds and other articles of personal use or or-
6 nament shall be held only in a building the owner,
7 lessee or occupant of which holds a license to
8 set up an auctioneering establishment therein from
9 the licensing authority. Such licenses may be is-
10 sued by the licensing authority of any town upon
11 the payment of a license fee of ten dollars to such
12 town. Said license may be suspended or revoked
13 without a hearing by the licensing authority, and
14 in Boston shall be signed by the police commis-
15 sioner, elsewhere by the town clerk, and shall be
16 recorded in a book kept for such purposes.
