

By Mr. Meins of Boston, petition of Henry F. Long that the Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation be authorized to appoint assistants to the Director of the Division of Corporations, Public Service. Jan. 8.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act to provide for Certain Appointments in the Department of Corporations and Taxation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section four of chapter fourteen of the General
2 Laws as amended by section two of chapter four
3 hundred and eighty-six of the acts of nineteen hun-
4 dred and twenty-one and chapter three hundred
5 and thirty of the acts of nineteen hundred and
6 twenty-two is hereby further amended by inserting
7 after the word " assessors " in line thirty-two the
8 words:— and such assistants to the director of the
9 division of corporations for the purpose of carry-
10 ing out the provisions of chapter sixty-three of the
11 General Laws,— so that the eighth paragraph of
12 section four will read as follows:— He may
13 appoint two permanent clerks, and may fix
14 their salaries, and may appoint such assistants
15 to the director of the income tax division, and such
16 assistants and clerks to the income tax assessors,

17 and such assistants to the director of the division
18 of corporations for the purpose of carrying out the
19 provisions of chapter sixty-three of the General
20 Laws, as the governor and council may deem neces-
21 sary, and may fix their salaries.
