

By Mr. Sullivan of Boston, petition of James M. Curley, mayor, relative to preferences under the civil service law to widows registered for service as matrons in the city of Boston. Public Service. Jan. 12.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act relative to Granting Preferences under Civil Service Law to Widows registering for Service as Matrons in the Labor Service of the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter four hundred
2 and seventy-six of the acts of nineteen hundred and
3 twenty-three is hereby amended by striking out said
4 section and inserting in place thereof the follow-
5 ing:—

6 *Section 1.* Widows who register with the depart-
7 ment of civil service and registration for employ-
8 ment as matrons, scrubwomen or helpers in the
9 labor service of said city, if found qualified, shall
10 be placed on the eligible list for the class in which
11 they register ahead of all other applicants. The
12 names of widows eligible for matrons, scrubwomen
13 and helpers shall be certified for labor service in
14 said city in preference to other persons eligible ac-
15 cording to the method of certification prescribed by
16 the civil service rules.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
