## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act establishing the Salary of the Court Officer for the Municipal Court of the Brighton District of the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and eighteen  
2 of the General Laws, as amended in section eighty-  
3 three by section one of chapter three hundred and  
4 twenty-one of the acts of nineteen hundred and  
5 twenty-one and by section one of chapter three hun-  
6 dred and twenty-two of the acts of nineteen hun-  
7 dred and twenty-three, is hereby further amended  
8 by striking out said section eighty-three and insert-  
9 ing in place thereof the following:—

10 *Section 83.* The salaries of court officers in the  
11 East Boston district court and in the municipal  
12 court of the Brighton district, the Charlestown dis-  
13 trict, the Dorchester district, the Roxbury dis-  
14 trict, the South Boston district and the West Rox-  
15 bury district shall be two thousand dollars, each.

16 Court officers in other district courts, except the  
17 municipal court of the city of Boston, shall receive

18 salaries to be fixed by the justice, subject to the ap-  
19 proval of the county commisioners, payable upon  
20 vouchers approved by the justice and the county  
21 commissioners.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 acceptance by vote of the city council of the city of  
3 Boston, subject to the provisions of its charter; pro-  
4 vided, that such acceptance occurs prior to Decem-  
5 ber thirty-first in the current year.
