By Mr. Edward J. Kelley of Worcester, petition of Charles H. McGlue relative to sessions of registrars of voters preceding biennial state primary elections. Election Laws. Jan. 22.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act relative to Sessions of Registrars of Voters preceding
Biennial State Primaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twenty-eight of chapter fifty-one of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by adding after the words
3 "preceding the" in the third line, the words:— biennial
4 state primaries, — so that said section as amended shall
5 read as follows:— *Section 28.* They shall hold a con-
6 tinuous session from twelve o'clock noon until ten o'clock
7 in the evening on the last day for registration preceding
8 the biennial state primaries, the biennial state election
9 and the annual city election or town meeting, except
10 that in towns having less than three hundred voters,
11 said session shall be sufficient if it includes the time
12 from two to four o'clock in the afternoon, and from seven
13 to ten o'clock in the evening.
