An Act reviving Certain Corporations.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would cause
2 inconvenience and expense, therefore it is hereby declared
3 to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate
4 preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The following named corporations, which were dissolved
2 by the chapters set opposite their respective names, are
3 hereby revived with the same powers, duties and obliga-
4 tions as if the said chapters had not been passed.

Sawtelle Coal Company, Inc.	Chapter two hundred and thirty of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
