## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

---

An Act to provide for the Care and Treatment of Certain Retired Members of the Boston Retirement System out of Their Retirement Allowances.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section twenty-six of chapter five hundred and twenty-  
2 one of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-two is  
3 hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the fol-  
4 lowing new sentence:— If a retired member becomes a  
5 charge upon the city of Boston the expense incurred by  
6 said city for his maintenance and support shall be  
7 deducted from his retirement allowance under the retire-  
8 ment system as said allowance becomes due and payable,  
9 and the amount of such deduction shall thereupon be  
10 paid over to the city collector of said city who shall  
11 credit the same to general income,— so as to read as  
12 follows:— *Section 26.* Any amounts paid or payable by  
13 the city of Boston under the provisions of the work-  
14 men's compensation law to a member or to the depend-  
15 ents of a member on account of death or disability shall  
16 be offset against and payable in lieu of any benefits  
17 payable out of funds provided by the city of Boston  
18 under the provisions of this act on account of the death  
19 or disability of a member. If the value of the total  
20 commuted benefits under the workmen's compensation

21 law is less than the reserve on the pension otherwise  
22 payable under this act, the value of such commuted  
23 payments shall be deducted from such pension reserve  
24 and such benefits as may be provided by the pension  
25 reserve so reduced shall be payable under the pro-  
26 visions of this act. If a retired member becomes a  
27 charge upon the city of Boston the expense incurred by  
28 said city for his maintenance and support shall be de-  
29 ducted from his retirement allowance under the retire-  
30 ment system as said allowance becomes due and payable,  
31 and the amount of such deduction shall thereupon be  
32 paid over to the city collector of said city who shall  
33 credit the same to general income.
