## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

Resolve providing for a Special Commission to investigate the Matter of the Establishment and Maintenance of Branch Offices for the Registration of Motor Vehicles.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, consisting of the  
2 chairman of the finance committee of the executive  
3 council appointed to consider matters of finance, the  
4 chairman of the commission on administration and  
5 finance and the commissioner of public works, is hereby  
6 established to investigate the matter of the establishment  
7 of branch offices for the registration of motor vehicles,  
8 the question of whether public necessity and convenience  
9 requires the establishing of additional branch offices  
10 throughout the commonwealth and what other methods  
11 for the distribution of number plates, if any, would in  
12 its opinion, facilitate the registration of motor vehicles.  
13 Said commission shall report its recommendations, if  
14 any, together with drafts of legislation accompanying  
15 the same, by filing the same with the clerk of the house  
16 of representatives on or before December fifteenth in the  
17 current year.
