AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURES OF MONEY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF LOBSTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred and thirty of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in section two of chapter three
3 hundred and twenty-nine of the acts of nineteen
4 hundred and thirty-three, is hereby amended by in-
5 serting after section forty the following new section:—
6 *Section 40A.* The state supervisor of marine
7 fisheries, under the direction of the commissioner of
8 conservation, may establish a lobster hatchery for
9 the propagation of lobsters. The said lobster hatchery
10 to be located in the Lagoon pond in the town of Oak
11 Bluffs, and may annually spend, subject to appro-
12 priation, sums not exceeding, in the aggregate, ten
13 thousand dollars.
