RESOLUTIONS PROTESTING AGAINST ANY PROPOSED NULLIFICATION BY THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT OF THE BALFOUR DECLARATION, RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A JEWISH NATIONAL HOMELAND IN PALESTINE.

1 *Resolved*, That The General Court of Massachu-
2 setts views with alarm reports of proposed action
3 by the British government whereby the Balfour
4 Declaration, relating to the establishment of a Jewish
5 national homeland in Palestine, would be nullified,
6 thus creating additional and unjust hardship to the
7 Jewish people; and be it further
8 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be trans-
9 mitted forthwith by the Secretary of the Common-
10 wealth to the President of the United States, the
11 Secretary of State of the United States, the Prime
12 Minister of England, the British Ambassador at
13 Washington, the presiding officer of each branch of
14 Congress and to the members of Congress from this
15 Commonwealth.
