

HOUSE No. 1119

By Mr. Kaplan of Boston, petition of Charles Kaplan for legislation to provide for payments of not less than forty dollars a month under the law granting assistance to certain aged persons. Pensions and Municipal Finance (sitting jointly).

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF NOT LESS THAN FORTY DOLLARS A MONTH UNDER THE OLD AGE ASSISTANCE LAW, SO CALLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section one of chapter one hundred and eighteen
2 A of the General Laws, as amended by section one
3 of chapter four hundred and forty of the acts of
4 nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, is hereby amended
5 by striking out the last sentence and inserting in
6 place thereof the following:—

7 Such assistance shall be paid by check or cash
8 which shall be delivered to the applicant at his resi-
9 dence if he so requests, and shall be at a rate of not
10 less than forty dollars a month for each recipient.
