## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Nine.

AN ACT GIVING THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE OF DISTRICT COURTS AUTHORITY AS TO OFFICE HOURS OF CLERKS OF DISTRICT COURTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section fifteen of chapter two hundred and eight-  
2 teen of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-  
3 ing out said section fifteen, as appearing in the Ter-  
4 centenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the  
5 following:—

6 *Section 15.* Justices of district courts, other than  
7 the municipal court of the city of Boston, shall, with  
8 the approval of the administrative committee of the  
9 district courts prescribe the hour when the respec-  
10 tive courts shall open for the transaction of business  
11 and the daily office hours for the clerks of their re-  
12 spective courts during which the offices of the clerks  
13 shall be open. Such hours shall be fixed with refer-

14 ence to the business of said courts and the convenience  
15 of the public and of attorneys, and notice thereof  
16 shall be posted in a conspicuous place in each of said  
17 offices.

18 In the event that the hour prescribed by any jus-  
19 tice shall not be approved by the administrative  
20 committee, it may prescribe such hours and they  
21 shall have the force of law and the court shall open  
22 for the transaction of business and the daily office  
23 hours of the clerks shall be as prescribed by said  
24 order.
