AN ACT CHANGING THE PROVISIONS OF LAW RESPECTING  
LICENSE FEES FOR LICENSES TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEV-

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-  
sentatives in General Court assembled, and by the  
authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section twelve of chapter one hundred and thirty-  
2 eight of the General Laws, as amended, is hereby  
3 further amended by striking out the fourth paragraph,  
4 as appearing in section one of chapter four hundred  
5 and sixty-eight of the acts of nineteen hundred and  
6 thirty-five, and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
7 ing:—

8 License fees for all classes of licenses for the sale  
9 of all alcoholic beverages or wines and malt beverages  
10 only shall be determined upon by the alcoholic  
11 beverage commission.
