AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE OF CIGARETTES BY MACHINE OR MECHANICAL DEVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Whoever installs a machine or any mechanical de-
2 vice that sells cigarettes, snuff or tobacco, and any
3 of above, is purchased by any person under eighteen
4 years of age will be punished by law by a fine not
5 under fifty dollars and six months imprisonment.
