The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Nine.

AN ACT REQUIRING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION TO COMPENSATE CERTAIN PEDLERS FOR LOSS OF BUSINESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any person or corporation owning and conducting
2 at the time of the passage of this act an established
3 business as a regular pedler, who at regular times
4 receives orders and delivers goods, in any of the towns
5 in the territory defined in chapter three hundred and
6 twenty-one of the acts of nineteen hundred and
7 twenty-seven, and whose business is decreased in
8 value, whether by loss of custom or otherwise, shall
9 be entitled to recover damages for said losses. The
10 commission, however, in its discretion, may make
11 such settlement with said person or corporation as it
12 shall deem just.
