AN ACT REQUIRING THE STAMPING OF BEEF AND OTHER MEATS SO AS TO SHOW THE GRADE THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Whoever by himself or by his agent sells or offers
- 2 for sale any beef, veal or lamb which is not stamped
- 3 or branded so as to show the grade thereof shall be
- 4 punished by a fine of not more than hun-
- 5 dred dollars.
