AN ACT AUTHORIZING CERTAIN COUNTIES TO ENGAGE IN CERTAIN PUBLIC WORKS IN CONJUNCTION WITH FEDERAL AGENCIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any county, except Suffolk, if authorized by the
2 county commissioners may engage in any useful pub-
3 lic works project which will tend to relieve unem-
4 ployment in conjunction with the Public Works Asso-
5 ciation, the Works Progress Association or any other
6 federal agency. Any such county may accept and
7 use for carrying out any such project, any grant, loan
8 or subsidy of federal funds.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Department

Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch in that State.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Representatives of that State. No Senator shall be a Person who, when elected, shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, and seven Years shall have elapsed since the Emigration of his Ancestors from Europe.
