AN ACT MAKING THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS APPLICABLE TO THE TOWN OF SCITUATE, WITH RESPECT TO ITS WATER DEPARTMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter thirty-one  
2 of the General Laws and rules, made thereunder,  
3 including those relative to the employment of laborers  
4 designated as, "labor service," shall be in force in the  
5 town of Scituate with respect to all appointive offices  
6 and positions in the water department of said town.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the  
2 voters of said town at a town meeting within one  
3 year in the form of the following question, which  
4 shall be placed on the official ballot to be used for the  
5 election of town officers at said town meeting: "Shall  
6 an act passed by the general court in the year nine-

7 teen hundred and thirty-nine, entitled, 'An Act mak-  
8 ing the Provisions of the Civil Service Laws Appli-  
9 cable to the Town of Scituate, with respect to its  
10 Water Department' be accepted?"

11 If a majority of the votes cast in answer to said  
12 question are in the affirmative, then this act shall  
13 thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
