AN ACT FURTHER RELATING TO THE NON-CRIMINAL DISPOSITION OF
PARKING VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The third paragraph of section 20A of chapter 90 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second
3 and third sentences, inserted by section 2 of chapter 386 of
4 the acts of 1955, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence: — If any person fails to appear in accordance with
6 the summons issued upon such complaint, the court shall issue
7 a warrant for his arrest and the clerk shall notify the regis-
8 trar, who shall forthwith suspend the right of such person to
9 operate motor vehicles, or his license, if any, to operate the
10 same, and shall not reinstate such right or license or issue a
11 renewal thereof to such person until after notice from the
12 clerk of the court disposing of such complaint that the same
13 has been disposed of in accordance with law; and it shall be
14 the duty of the clerk of the court disposing of such complaint
15 to notify the registrar forthwith that such case has been so
16 disposed of.
