AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE VOTE REQUIRED FOR GRANTING SPECIAL PERMITS FOR EXCEPTIONS UNDER ZONING ORDINANCES AND BY-LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 19 of chapter forty A of the General Laws as most
2 recently amended by chapter 349 of the acts of 1955 is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the second paragraph and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: — The
5 concurring vote of all the members of a board of appeals con-
6 sisting of not more than four members, and the concurring
7 vote of all except one member of a board consisting of more
8 than four members, shall be necessary to reverse any order or
9 decision of any administrative official under this chapter, or
10 to effect any variance in the application of any such ordinance
11 or by-law. The concurring vote of a majority of the members
12 of a board of appeals or of a city council, or of a board of se-
13 lectmen, as the case may be, shall be necessary to decide an
14 application for a special permit for an exception as provided
15 in section four upon which such board of appeals or city coun-
16 cil or board of selectmen is required to pass.
