AN ACT PROVIDING A TRAVEL ALLOWANCE FOR THE JUSTICE OF THE SECOND DISTRICT COURT OF BARNSTABLE WHENEVER HE SITS IN THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF BARNSTABLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 81 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end the following paragraph: —
3 Whenever the justice of the second district court of Barn-
4 stable sits in the first district court of Barnstable the county
5 of Barnstable shall pay him a travel allowance at the rate of
6 eight cents per mile travelled, computed either from the town
7 in which the main office of the clerk of said second district
8 court of Barnstable is established or from the place of resi-
9 dence of said justice to the town in which the session of said
10 first district court is held and return, whichever is the shorter
11 distance.
