PROPOSAL FOR A LEGISLATIVE AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION
ABOLISHING THE REQUIREMENT THAT CERTAIN REVENUES DERIVED
FROM THE USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND THE USE OF FUELS USED
FOR PROPELLING THE SAME BE USED FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES
ONLY.

1 A majority of all the members elected to the Senate and House
2 of Representatives, in joint session, hereby declares it to be
3 expedient to alter the Constitution by the adoption of the follow-
4 ing Article of Amendment, to the end that it may become a part
5 of the Constitution [if similarly agreed to in a joint session of
6 the next General Court and approved by the people at the state
7 election next following]:

8 ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

9 ART. . . Article LXXVIII of the amendments to the con-
10 stitution is hereby annulled.
