AN ACT REPEALING THE PROVISIONS OF LAW REQUIRING A SIGNED CERTIFICATE FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY PHARMACISTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Sections thirty D, thirty E and thirty F of chapter one hun-
2 dred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, each as most re-
3 cently amended by chapter four hundred and forty of the acts
4 of nineteen hundred and thirty-five, are hereby repealed.

The Council of Representatives

The Council of Representatives is composed of members elected by the people of each State and the District of Columbia. The members of the Council are elected for a term of two years, and one-half of them are elected every second year. The Council meets in regular session at the Capitol in Washington, D. C., on the first Monday in January of each year. It may also meet in special session at any time when called together by the President.
