AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE GRANTING OF PERIODIC INCREASES IN SALARY TO CERTAIN WIDOWS OF POLICEMEN AND FIREMEN KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 89B of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by section 3 of chapter 614 of the acts of 1963,
3 is hereby further amended by inserting after the second para-
4 graph:—

5 In the event the annual salary of a policeman or fireman
6 killed in the line of duty has been granted to his widow by the
7 legislature all periodic increases in salary granted to the police
8 or fire department of which the deceased was a member shall be
9 given to his widow.
