AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A FIFTH ASSISTANT CLERK FOR THE CENTRAL
DISTRICT COURT OF WORCESTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 10 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the third paragraph the following
3 paragraph: —

4 A fifth assistant clerk with salary payable by the county may
5 be appointed, subject to the approval of the county commis-
6 sioners, in the central district court of Worcester.

The Constitution of the State of New York

As amended by the Convention of 1894 and 1901

An Act to amend the Constitution of the State of New York, by adding to the same the following provisions, to wit:

Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor of the State.

Section 2. The Legislative Power shall be vested in the Senate and Assembly.

Section 3. The Judicial Power shall be vested in the Chief Justice of the State, the Justices of the Court of Appeals, the Justices of the Supreme Court, the Justices of the County Courts, and the Justices of the City Courts.

Section 4. The Electors shall be qualified to elect members of the Legislature.

Section 5. The Electors shall be qualified to elect members of the Executive and Judicial Branches.

Section 6. The Electors shall be qualified to elect members of the County and City Courts.

Section 7. The Electors shall be qualified to elect members of the Justices of the County and City Courts.

Section 8. The Electors shall be qualified to elect members of the Justices of the County and City Courts.
