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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Four.

### AN ACT TO PERMIT THE ELECTION OF POLITICAL COMMITTEES IN THE VOTING PRECINCTS OF ALL TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 52 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof  
3 the following sentence:— Each political party shall, in every  
4 ward, every precinct in multiple precinct towns and all single  
5 precinct towns, elect at the presidential primaries from among  
6 the enrolled members of the party resident in such ward, precinct  
7 or town, a committee to be called a ward, precinct or town  
8 committee, whose members shall hold office for four years from  
9 May fifteenth following their election and until their successors  
10 shall have organized. Precinct committees shall be limited to a  
11 maximum of ten members in each precinct in multiple precinct  
12 towns and to a maximum of thirty-five members in single  
13 precinct towns.

The Commission of Enquiry
