AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE COMMON DAY OF REST LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 section 2 of chapter 616 of the acts of 1962, as amended by
3 chapter 230 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out clause (29) and inserting in place thereof the fol-
5 lowing clause: —

6 (29) The sale, at retail, of gifts, souvenirs, antiques, hand
7 crafted goods, books and art goods, in an establishment primarily
8 engaged in the sale of such merchandise, or on the premises of a
9 licensed common victualler.
