AN ACT REQUIRING A PERMIT TO ALLOW PERSONS TO ENGAGE IN
GAS FITTING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 143 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 3N, as inserted by section 2 of chapter 737
3 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 section:—

5 *Section 3N.* No person shall engage in gas fitting in any city
6 or town without first making application to the proper authority
7 designated under the provisions of section three O of this chapter
8 and obtaining a permit, in accordance with the local building
9 code, if any.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT PASSED IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY SEVEN, RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF DEEDS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Conference on the Thirtieth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven.

- 1 Chapter 266 of the Statutes of this Commonwealth is hereby amended so that the words "and the register of deeds" shall be inserted after the word "and" in section 1 of said chapter.
- 2 of the year one thousand nine hundred and seven in the following words, to-wit:
- 3 "SECTION 1. The register of deeds shall be appointed by the Governor and shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment."
