

HOUSE No. 2117

By Mr. Bohigian of Worcester, petition of Robert J. Bohigian that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be prohibited from suspending or revoking motor vehicle licenses or registrations without a hearing. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES FROM SUSPENDING OR REVOKING LICENSES OR REGISTRATIONS WITHOUT A HEARING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 22 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the first paragraph, as appearing in the Ter-
3 centenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 paragraph:—

5 The registrar may suspend or revoke any certificate of regis-
6 tration or any license issued under this chapter, after due notice
7 and a hearing has been granted to the owner or operator as the
8 case may be, for any cause which he may deem sufficient, and
9 neither the certificate of registration nor the license shall be re-
10 issued unless, upon examination or investigation, the registrar
11 determines that the operator should again be permitted to
12 operate. The registrar, under the same conditions and for the
13 same causes, may also suspend the right of any person to op-
14 erate motor vehicles in the commonwealth under section ten
15 until he shall have received a license from the registrar.
