AN ACT EXEMPTING PENSIONS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE
INCOME TAX LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Any pension, retirement allowance or annuity payable under
- 2 the provisions of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws shall
- 3 be exempt from taxation under the provisions of chapter sixty-
- 4 two of the General Laws.
