AN ACT TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE MYSTIC RIVER BRIDGE TO THE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY BRIDGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The bridge spanning the Mystic river currently
2 designated the Mystic River bridge, shall now be known and
3 designated as the President John F. Kennedy bridge and a suit-
4 able tablet or marker bearing said designation shall be erected
5 at said bridge by the Massachusetts Port Authority.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

1. The Commission on the Administration of Justice shall report to the President and the Senate on or before the first day of January, 1915, a report containing a full and complete statement of the present condition of the courts of the United States, and of the manner in which they are administered, and of the means for their improvement, and such other information as may be necessary to enable the President and the Senate to take such action as they may deem proper.

The Commission on the Administration of Justice

is to be the President of the United States

2. The Commission shall consist of the Chief Justice of the United States, the President of the Supreme Court, and such other persons as the President may designate.

3. The Commission shall hold its first meeting on or before the first day of January, 1915, and shall continue to hold its meetings until it has completed its report.

4. The Commission shall have the honor and privilege of access to all records, papers, and documents in the possession of the Department of Justice, and of the courts of the United States, and of such other persons as may be necessary to enable it to perform its duties.

6. That the President may from time to time remove any member of the Commission, and may also remove any member of the Commission at any time.
