AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CHILDREN ATTENDING SPECIAL CLASSES FOR THE MENTALLY RETARDED IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 46 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:—
- 3 Any child under sixteen years of age who is attending a special
- 4 class for the mentally retarded under the provisions of this
- 5 section shall have a right to continue to attend such class upon
- 6 reaching the age of sixteen if the child's parent or guardian so
- 7 requests.
