The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Four.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A SIX MONTHS PERIOD OF GRACE FROM AND AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF OPERATORS' LICENSES ISSUED BY THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES, WITHIN WHICH PERIOD SUCH LICENSES SHALL BE FULLY EFFECTIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by chapter 687 of the acts of 1962
3 is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the
4 following sentence:— Every license or renewal thereof shall
5 be effective for an additional period of six months from and
6 after its expiration date and the fee for renewal thereof shall
7 be increased by one dollar for each month or fraction of a month
8 in which, during said additional period, the license has not been
9 renewed; provided, however, that if a licensee surrenders his
10 license to the registrar or renews the same on or before its expira-
11 tion date there shall be no increase in the fee otherwise provided
12 for license renewal.

1 SECTION 2. The registrar is hereby authorized and directed,
2 from and after the effective date of this act, to print or stamp on
3 all licenses to be issued, the following words:— This license shall
4 be effective for a period of six months from and after the expira-
5 tion date hereon.

The Government of the State

In the Year 1867

Section 1. The Governor shall be elected by the people for a term of four years, and shall hold office until the first day of January following the year in which he is elected.

Section 2. The Governor shall have the honor and privilege of the chair, and shall be styled His Excellency.

Section 3. Section 4. The Governor shall have the power to appoint and remove all officers and ministers of the State, and to grant commissions to all officers and ministers of the State.
