By Messrs. O'Farrell of Malden and Anderson of Belmont, petition of Carlton K. Brown for legislation to exempt certain tree wardens, moth superintendents and arborists from the requirement of a license for the application of pesticides. Public Health.

AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN TREE WARDENS, MOTH SUPERINTENDENTS AND ARBORISTS FROM PROCURING A LICENSE FOR THE APPLICATION OF PESTICIDES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty-one C of
2 chapter ninety-four B of the General Laws, a person who was
3 employed as a tree warden or moth superintendent of a city or
4 town as of January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-two, and
5 an arborist with five years of experience in arboriculture as of
6 January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-two, shall not be
7 required to procure a license for the application of pesticides.
