RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF HOWARD C. NEWTON, DEAN OF THE MASSACHUSETTS COLLEGE OF PHARMACY.

1 *Whereas*, The Massachusetts House of Representatives has
2 learned with deep regret of the death of Howard C. Newton,
3 Dean of the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy since nineteen
4 hundred and thirty-seven; and

5 *Whereas*, Born in Southborough, Dean Newton was a gradu-
6 ate of the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Creighton
7 University. He also studied at Howard University and the
8 University of Omaha; and

9 *Whereas*, In addition to his position as Dean of the Massa-
10 chusetts College of Pharmacy, Dean Newton was a fellow of
11 the American College of Apothecaries, a member of the Ameri-
12 can Pharmacists Association, the American Association of Col-
13 leges of Pharmacy, the National Research Council, the New
14 Hampshire, Maine and Vermont Pharmacists Associations, the
15 Boston Druggists Association and the American Pharmacists
16 Association's Foundation; and

17 *Whereas*, Because of his example, interest and understanding
18 many young folk were encouraged to pursue their studies be-
19 yond the College of Pharmacy and today are successful because
20 of being under the direction of this capable man; and

21 *Whereas*, During his tenure as Dean, he was of immeasur-
22 able assistance to the students at the College of Pharmacy, and
23 many of them were encouraged by him to pursue their studies
24 beyond the College level; therefore be it

25 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
26 hereby expresses to his bereaved family its profound sympathy
27 in their great loss; and be it further

28 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted
29 forthwith by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the mem-
30 bers of his bereaved family.
