RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF CHARLES H. SLOWEY.

1 *Whereas*, The Massachusetts House of Representatives has
2 learned with deep regret of the sudden death of Charles H.
3 Slowey, a former member of this assembly from the city of Lowell;
4 and

5 *Whereas*, Charles H. Slowey served with honor and distinc-
6 tion in the House of Representatives from 1917 to 1930 with
7 the exception of three years, one of which was served with the
8 armed forces; later he was elected mayor of the city of Lowell
9 and later appointed postmaster for said city: and

10 *Whereas*, Charles H. Slowey not only achieved high office
11 because of his great ability but gained the respect of the citi-
12 zens of Lowell by reason of his devotion to duty, his loyalty,
13 friendship and his steadfastness of purpose; and

14 *Whereas*, During his long and distinguished career in his native
15 city of Lowell, not only was he active in political circles but
16 also in the business and civic life of said city as well; there-
17 fore be it

18 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
19 extends to the family of the late Charles H. Slowey its deepest
20 sympathy and condolences; and be it further

21 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be forwarded by
22 the secretary of the commonwealth to the family of the late
23 Charles H. Slowey.
