AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE FOR CERTAIN FEMALE SCHOOL TRAFFIC SUPERVISORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 162 of the acts of 1963 is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 2 and inserting in place thereof the following sec-
3 tion:—

4 *Section 2.* The tenure of office of every female who, on or
5 before April first, nineteen hundred and sixty-three, was (1) a
6 school traffic supervisor or (2) a person not a member of the
7 regular police force, who was doing only intermittent work pro-
8 tecting school children going to and from schools, shall be un-
9 limited, subject, however, to the civil service laws and rules;
10 provided, she passes a qualifying examination which shall be
11 given to her by the division of civil service for such position.
12 If she passes such examination, she shall be certified for said
13 position and shall be deemed to be permanently appointed
14 thereto without being required to serve any probationary period.
