RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO RECODIFYING AND CLARIFYING THE STATUTORY PROVISIONS GOVERNING URBAN RENEWAL AND OF FURTHER IMPROVING STATE, REGIONAL AND LOCAL PLANNING.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of  
2 two members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-  
3 sentatives, three persons to be appointed by the governor, and  
4 the chairman of the state housing board or his designee, is hereby  
5 established for the purpose of making an investigation and  
6 study of the subject matter of current house documents num-  
7 bered 1147, relative to recodifying and clarifying the statutory  
8 provisions governing urban renewal and to further improve state,  
9 regional and local planning; and 2918, relative to recodifying  
10 and clarifying the statutory provisions governing urban renewal  
11 and to further improve state, regional and local planning.
