AN ACT RELATIVE TO A CONTRACT FOR SALE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 12 of chapter 255B of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following
3 paragraph:—

4 Any clause in a contract for the sale of a motor vehicle,
5 which provides that said contract is subject to acceptance by
6 someone other than the salesman, will be illegal and ineffective.
