AN ACT EXEMPTING THE SALES OF VESSELS USED FOR COMMERCIAL FISHING FROM THE TEMPORARY TAX ON RETAIL SALES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

The Constitution of the State of New York

ARTICLE I. OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

SECTION 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor of this State.

1. The Governor shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election.
2. He shall be elected by the people of this State.
