## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING CERTAIN NON-RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD TO TAKE THE EXAMINATION FOR THE POSITION OF POLICE OFFICER.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of special or  
2 general law to the contrary, a non-resident of the city of  
3 Springfield who resides within a radius of fifteen miles from  
4 the perimeter of said city may take the examination for the  
5 position of police officer in said city if otherwise eligible;  
6 provided, however, that such non-resident shall have been  
7 domiciled within said radius for at least one year next prior to  
8 the date of such examination; and provided, further, that any  
9 such non-resident who receives a permanent appointment as  
10 police officer in said city shall have to establish his residence  
11 in said city to retain said appointment.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by  
2 the city of Springfield.
