The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN RECORDS OF AUTHORITIES ESTABLISHED BY THE GENERAL COURT TO SERVE A PUBLIC PURPOSE SHALL BE OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 All records of every authority established by the general court
2 to serve a public purpose shall be open to public inspection ex-
3 cept those records which by general or special statute, or federal
4 grant-in-aid requirements, cannot be made public, and except
5 those records which if made public might adversely affect the
6 public security.

7 Every authority established by the general court to serve a
8 public purpose which has no official designated by statute as cus-
9 todian of its records shall designate a custodian who shall have
10 the custody of such records. Upon receipt of a written request
11 identifying the general nature and time period of the records to
12 be inspected, the custodian shall procure the records requested
13 and permit the inspection of the same by the person making
14 such request at reasonable times during business hours. The
15 custodian shall furnish copies of any records so requested upon
16 the payment of a reasonable fee for the expense of preparing
17 the requested copies.
