AN ACT PROVIDING STATE REIMBURSEMENT FOR CERTAIN SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 70 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 4 the following sec-
3 tion:—

4 *Section 4A.* The state treasurer in making annual pay-
5 ments to the several towns of the amounts required under
6 this chapter shall pay to each town comprising a regional
7 school district an additional amount equal to fifteen per cent
8 of the amount to which such town would be entitled if such
9 regional school district had not been formed. No payment
10 shall be made under this section to any such town prior to
11 the date of award of a contract for the construction of a
12 regional school by the regional district school committee.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 74 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 9, as amended by section 67
3 of chapter 14 of the acts of 1966, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 9.* The commonwealth shall annually pay one half
6 of the net maintenance sums to towns, or regional school
7 districts maintaining local or district or regional school
8 district independent distributive occupations, industrial,
9 agricultural, household arts or practical nursing training
10 schools, except agricultural departments in high schools.
