By Mr. McGinn of Westfield, petition of Robert J. McGinn that certain trucks operating on public ways other than on express highways be allowed to haul sand and gravel without a cover. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

AN ACT ALLOWING THE HAULING OF SAND AND GRAVEL WITHIN A CITY OR TOWN FOR A DISTANCE OF ONE AND ONE HALF MILES WITHOUT A COVER WHEN THE PUBLIC WAY IS NOT AN EXPRESS HIGHWAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 36 of chapter 85 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 518 of the acts of 1965, is hereby further
3 amended by inserting before the last sentence the following
4 sentence:—A vehicle as defined in section one of chapter
5 ninety may be driven or moved without a cover when the
6 public way is within a city or town for a distance of one and one
7 half miles and when the public way is not an express highway.
