AN ACT TO INCREASE THE PER DIEM COMPENSATION OF A JUSTICE OF  
A DISTRICT COURT WHEN SITTING IN THE SUPERIOR COURT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 14 E of chapter 212 of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence  
3 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— A  
4 justice of a district court when sitting in the superior court,  
5 as provided by section fourteen B, shall receive from the com-  
6 monwealth, in addition to his regular salary, upon certificate  
7 of the chief justice of the superior court, the amount of ex-  
8 pense incurred by him in the discharge of his duties in con-  
9 nection with such sessions and also such compensation for  
10 each court day, while so sitting, as will, when added to the  
11 per diem rate of his regular salary, computed as provided in  
12 section eight-four of chapter two hundred and eighteen,  
13 amount to eighty-two dollars and fifty cents.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
