## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT PROHIBITING MEMBERS OF COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL COMMISSIONS OR BOARDS FROM BEING APPOINTED OR ELECTED TO CERTAIN OTHER POSITIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 8A of chapter 268A of the General Laws, as inserted  
2 by chapter 314 of the acts of 1964, is hereby amended by strik-  
3 ing out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the fol-  
4 lowing sentence: — No member of a state, county or municipal  
5 commission or board shall be eligible for appointment or elec-  
6 tion by the members of such commission or board to any office  
7 or position under the supervision of such commission or board.

The Constitution of the State

In the State of New York

As the Legislature of the State of New York is now assembled in regular session, I have the honor to inform you that the following bill has been passed by the Senate and the Assembly, and is now ready for your signature.

The bill is entitled "An Act to amend the Constitution of the State in relation to the mode of electing the Governor and the mode of electing the Judges of the Court of Sessions."

The bill provides that the Governor shall be elected by the electors of the State, and that the Judges of the Court of Sessions shall be elected by the electors of the County in which they respectively hold office. The bill also provides that the term of office of the Governor shall be four years, and that the term of office of the Judges of the Court of Sessions shall be six years.
