By Mr. McGinn of Westfield, petition of Robert J. McGinn for legislation to provide an exemption from real property taxes to the amount of two thousand dollars for persons who have suffered permanent loss of use of both legs. Taxation.

AN ACT PROVIDING AN EXEMPTION FROM REAL PROPERTY TAXES TO THE AMOUNT OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR PERSONS WHO HAVE SUFFERED PERMANENT LOSS OF BOTH LEGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 59 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after clause Forty-third added
3 by section 2 of chapter 267 of the acts of 1965 the following
4 clause:—

5 Forty-fourth, Real estate, to the amount of two thousand
6 dollars of a person who has suffered permanent loss of use of
7 both legs and occupied by him as his domicile.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall apply to taxes assessed for the
2 year nineteen hundred and sixty-seven and subsequent years.
