AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE TO PAY THE THREE DOLLAR MONTHLY INSURANCE PREMIUM FOR OLD AGE ASSISTANCE RECIPIENTS REQUIRED UNDER THE MEDICAL INSURANCE PROGRAM OF PUBLIC LAW 89-97.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public welfare is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to pay the three dollar monthly insurance premium
- 3 for old age assistance recipients required under the medical in-
- 4 surance program of Public Law 89-97 of 1965, commonly re-
- 5 ferred to as Medicare.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

The Commission on the Administration of Justice was organized on July 1, 1937, by the Supreme Court of the United States. Its members are the Chief Justice, the Justices, and the members of the Council on the Judiciary.

The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from judges, lawyers, laymen, and laywomen. It has also conducted extensive research into the present organization of the courts.

The Commission believes that the present organization of the courts is largely satisfactory and that no fundamental changes are needed. However, certain changes are suggested to improve the administration of the courts. These changes are set forth in the following report.
