AN ACT ALLOWING THE PAYMENT OF MOTOR EXCISE TAXES BY THE TAXPAYER AT THE EXPIRATION OF NINETY DAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 60A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the seventh sentence and inserting
3 in place thereof the following sentence:—The excise here-
4 under shall be due and payable at the expiration of ninety
5 days from the date upon which the notice was issued by the
6 collector or the commissioner pursuant to this section.
